a.	<u>Incentive Pool/ECRIP</u> – provides support to teaching hospitals for training in biomedical research and other GME innovations (i.e. quality of education, regional networks and faculty development). 2/3 of the funds are distributed to NYC; 1/3 to the rest of the state through a RFP application process.	\$ 31 M	\$ 31 M	\$ 54 M
b.	<u>Ambulatory Training</u> – provides funding to teaching hospitals, medical schools and GME consortia that will be passed through to free-standing ambulatory care sites (currently not eligible for GME funding) to provide residency training in community-based settings. Regional funding distribution is similar to the the Incentive Pool/ECRIP program.	\$ 0	\$ 5 M	\$ 10 M
c.	<u>Physician Loan Repayment</u> – funds up to 100 awards annually with a maximum of \$150,000 in loan repayment over five years (using the following repayment percents: 15/15/20/25/25) for primary care and specialty physicians to practice in rural and inner-city underserved communities. Funding is distributed 2/3 to rural; 1/3 inner-city (with at least 50% to hospitals) per RFP.	\$ 0	\$ 2 M	\$ 4 M
d.	<u>Physician Practice Support</u> - provides up to \$100,000 in physician practice support over two years to encourage primary care and specialty physicians to practice in rural and inner-city underserved communities. Funding distribution is similar to the loan repayment program and available to enhance physician recruitment incentive packages.	\$ 0	\$ 5 M	\$ 10 M
e.	<u>Physician Studies</u> – provides funding to develop models on the physician workforce and future projections (i.e. community need, supply and demand for physicians).	\$ 0	\$ 600 K	\$ 600 K
f.	<u>Diversity in Medicine/Post-Baccalaureate Program</u> – expands the current program to provide minority and economically disadvantaged students who have been unsuccessful in gaining admission into medical school with 1 year of supplemental training. Currently there are 14 students enrolled in the program at the University at Buffalo (UB) and this will increase enrollment at UB and another site for up to 50 students annually.	\$ 0	\$ 2 M	\$ 2 M
